- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Title 5, Civil Practice and Remedies Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Chapter 115 to read as follows:

8 CHAPTER 115. MUNICIPAL LIABILITY

- 9 Sec. 115.0001. DISASTER RECOVERY AS GOVERNMENTAL FUNCTION.
- 10 (a) A municipality performs a governmental function if, after a
- 11 <u>declaration of a disaster under Section 418.014, Government Code,</u>
- 12 the municipality enters into a contract for a purpose related to
- 13 disaster recovery or takes an action under that contract.
- 14 (b) A municipality has governmental immunity to suit and
- 15 from liability for a cause of action arising from a governmental
- 16 function described by this section.
- 17 SECTION 2. Subchapter I, Chapter 271, Local Government
- 18 Code, is amended by adding Section 271.1515 to read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 271.1515. APPLICABILITY OF SUBCHAPTER. This
- 20 <u>subchapter does not apply to a contract with a local governmental</u>
- 21 entity that:
- 22 (1) arises from a declaration of a disaster under
- 23 <u>Section 418.014, Government Code; and</u>
- 24 (2) primarily spends state or federal funds on goods

- 1 and services that:
- 2 (A) benefit private citizens or private property
- 3 located in the entity in recovering from the disaster; and
- 4 (B) do not benefit the entity.
- 5 SECTION 3. Section 115.0001, Civil Practice and Remedies
- 6 Code, as added by this Act, and Section 271.1515, Local Government
- 7 Code, as added by this Act, apply only to a contract entered into or
- 8 action taken under the contract on or after the effective date of
- 9 this Act.
- 10 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
