- 3 schools and instructors; authorizing fees.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 1001.001(7), Education Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (7) "Driver education school" means an enterprise
- 8 that:
- 9 (A) maintains a place of business or solicits
- 10 business in this state; and
- 11 (B) is operated by an individual, association,
- 12 partnership, or corporation for educating and training persons [at
- 13 a primary or branch location] in driver education or driver
- 14 education instructor development.
- SECTION 2. Section 1001.151(e), Education Code, is amended
- 16 to read as follows:
- 17 (e) The commission may establish a fee for an application
- 18 for approval to offer a driver education course [by an alternative
- 19 method of instruction under Section 1001.3541].
- SECTION 3. Section 1001.204(b), Education Code, is amended
- 21 to read as follows:
- 22 (b) The department shall approve an application for a driver
- 23 education school license if the application is submitted on a form
- 24 approved by the department [executive director], the application is

- 1 accompanied by [includes] the fee, and the department determines
- 2 [on inspection of the premises of the school, it is determined] that
- 3 the school:
- 4 (1) has courses, curricula, and instruction of a
- 5 quality, content, and length that reasonably and adequately achieve
- 6 the stated objective for which the courses, curricula, and
- 7 instruction are offered;
- 8 (2) has adequate space, equipment, instructional
- 9 material, and instructors to provide training of good quality in
- 10 the classroom and behind the wheel, if applicable;
- 11 (3) has instructors who have adequate educational
- 12 qualifications and experience;
- 13 (4) provides to each student before enrollment:
- 14 (A) a copy of:
- 15 (i) the refund policy;
- 16 (ii) the schedule of tuition, fees, and
- 17 other charges; and
- 18 (iii) the regulations relating to absence,
- 19 grading policy, and rules of operation and conduct; and
- 20 (B) the department's name, mailing address,
- 21 telephone number, and Internet website address for the purpose of
- 22 directing complaints to the department;
- 23 (5) maintains adequate records as prescribed by the
- 24 department to show attendance and progress or grades and enforces
- 25 satisfactory standards relating to attendance, progress, and
- 26 conduct;
- 27 (6) on completion of training, issues each student a

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- 1 certificate indicating the course name and satisfactory
- 2 completion;
- 3 (7) complies with all county, municipal, state, and
- 4 federal regulations, including fire, building, and sanitation
- 5 codes and assumed name registration, if applicable;
- 6 (8) is financially sound and capable of fulfilling its
- 7 commitments for training;
- 8 (9) maintains and publishes as part of its student
- 9 enrollment contract the proper policy for the refund of the unused
- 10 portion of tuition, fees, and other charges if a student fails to
- 11 take the course or withdraws or is discontinued from the school at
- 12 any time before completion;
- 13 (10) does not use erroneous or misleading advertising,
- 14 either by actual statement, omission, or intimation, as determined
- 15 by the department;
- 16 (11) does not use a name similar to the name of another
- 17 existing school or tax-supported educational institution in this
- 18 state, unless specifically approved in writing by the executive
- 19 director;
- 20 (12) submits to the department for approval the
- 21 applicable course hour lengths and curriculum content for each
- 22 course offered by the school;
- 23 (13) does not owe an administrative penalty for a
- 24 violation of this chapter; [and]
- 25 (14) meets any additional criteria required by the
- 26 department, including any applicable inspection requirements; and
- 27 (15) provides adequate testing and security measures

- 1 for the school's method of instruction.
- 2 SECTION 4. Subchapter F, Chapter 1001, Education Code, is
- 3 amended by adding Sections 1001.2531, 1001.2532, 1001.2533,
- 4 1001.2534, and 1001.2535 to read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 1001.2531. DRIVER EDUCATION INSTRUCTOR REQUIREMENTS.
- 6 (a) The commission by rule shall establish standards for a driver
- 7 education instructor to be certified as a teaching assistant,
- 8 driver education teacher, or supervising teacher.
- 9 <u>(b) An applicant for a driver education instructor license</u>
- 10 <u>under this section must:</u>
- 11 (1) apply to the department on a form prescribed by the
- 12 department and under rules adopted by the commission;
- 13 (2) submit with the application a nonrefundable
- 14 application fee in an amount set by commission rule; and
- 15 (3) present satisfactory evidence to the department
- 16 that the applicant:
- 17 (A) is at least 21 years of age;
- 18 (B) holds a high school diploma or high school
- 19 equivalency certificate; and
- (C) meets any other requirement established by
- 21 <u>commission rule.</u>
- Sec. 1001.2532. TEACHING ASSISTANT. (a) A teaching
- 23 <u>assistant is a driver education instructor who is authorized to</u>
- 24 teach or provide only behind-the-wheel training.
- 25 (b) To be eligible to be certified as a teaching assistant,
- 26 a driver education instructor must:
- 27 (1) have successfully completed:

1	(A) six semester hours of driver and traffic
2	safety education from an accredited college or university; or
3	(B) a teaching assistant development course
4	approved by the department; and
5	(2) pass any required examination.
6	Sec. 1001.2533. DRIVER EDUCATION TEACHER. (a) A driver
7	education teacher is a driver education instructor who is
8	authorized to teach or provide behind-the-wheel training and
9	classroom training.
10	(b) To be eligible to be certified as a driver education
11	teacher, a driver education instructor must:
12	(1) have successfully completed:
13	(A) nine semester hours of driver and traffic
14	safety education from an accredited college or university; or
15	(B) a driver education teacher development
16	course approved by the department;
17	(2) pass any required examination; and
18	(3) comply with the additional requirements under
19	Section 1001.2535.
20	Sec. 1001.2534. SUPERVISING TEACHER. (a) A supervising
21	teacher is a driver education instructor who is authorized to teach
22	instructor training classes.
23	(b) To be eligible to be certified as a supervising teacher,
24	a driver education instructor must:
25	(1) have been certified as a driver education teacher
26	for at least one year; and
27	(2) have successfully completed:

- 1 (A) 15 semester hours of driver and traffic
- 2 safety education from an accredited college or university; or
- 3 (B) a supervising teacher development course
- 4 approved by the department; and
- 5 (3) comply with the additional requirements under
- 6 Section 1001.2535.
- 7 Sec. 1001.2535. ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR DRIVER
- 8 EDUCATION TEACHER AND SUPERVISING TEACHER. (a) In addition to the
- 9 requirements under Section 1001.2533 or 1001.2534, as applicable,
- 10 to be eligible to be certified as a driver education teacher or
- 11 supervising teacher, a driver education instructor must:
- 12 (1) hold a teaching certificate and any additional
- 13 <u>certification required by commission rule to teach driver</u>
- 14 education;
- 15 (2) have completed 15 semester hours in education
- 16 courses at an accredited college or university during the 10 years
- 17 before the application date; or
- 18 (3) have obtained an associate or baccalaureate degree
- 19 in education from an accredited college or university.
- 20 (b) The commission, department, or executive director may
- 21 adopt an alternative method to determine or verify an instructor's
- 22 eligibility under Subsection (a).
- SECTION 5. Subchapter H, Chapter 1001, Education Code, is
- 24 amended by adding Section 1001.3542 to read as follows:
- Sec. 1001.3542. METHOD OF INSTRUCTION FOR DRIVER EDUCATION
- 26 COURSE. A driver education school may teach a driver education
- 27 course by any method approved by the department, including an

- 1 <u>alternative method under Section 1001.3541 or a traditional method</u>
- 2 under Subchapter C.
- 3 SECTION 6. The following provisions of the Education Code
- 4 are repealed:
- 5 (1) Sections 1001.253, 1001.254, and 1001.256; and
- 6 (2) Section 1001.3541(b).
- 7 SECTION 7. (a) As soon as practicable after the effective
- 8 date of this Act, the Texas Commission on Licensing and Regulation
- 9 shall adopt rules to implement Section 1001.204(b), Education Code,
- 10 as amended by this Act, and Section 1001.2531, Education Code, as
- 11 added by this Act.
- 12 (b) A driver education instructor license issued under
- 13 Section 1001.253, Education Code, before the repeal of that section
- 14 by this Act, continues to be valid until the license expires, and
- 15 former Section 1001.253, Education Code, is continued in effect for
- 16 that purpose.
- 17 (c) A person who holds on the effective date of this Act a
- 18 driver education instructor license described by former Section
- 19 1001.253(b), Education Code, is entitled on expiration of that
- 20 license to issuance of a driver education instructor license
- 21 certified as a teaching assistant under Section 1001.2532,
- 22 Education Code, as added by this Act, if the person otherwise meets
- 23 the requirements for renewal of a driver education instructor
- 24 license certified as a teaching assistant.
- 25 (d) A person who holds on the effective date of this Act a
- 26 driver education instructor license described by former Section
- 27 1001.253(c), Education Code, is entitled on expiration of that

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- 1 license to issuance of a driver education instructor license
- 2 certified as a driver education teacher under Section 1001.2533,
- 3 Education Code, as added by this Act, if the person otherwise meets
- 4 the requirements for renewal of a driver education instructor
- 5 license certified as a driver education teacher.
- 6 (e) A person who holds on the effective date of this Act a
- 7 driver education instructor license described by former Section
- 8 1001.253(e), Education Code, is entitled on expiration of that
- 9 license to issuance of a driver education instructor license
- 10 certified as a supervising teacher under Section 1001.2534,
- 11 Education Code, as added by this Act, if the person otherwise meets
- 12 the requirements for renewal of a driver education instructor
- 13 license certified as a supervising teacher.
- 14 (f) The changes in law made by this Act do not affect the
- 15 validity of a disciplinary action or other proceeding that was
- 16 initiated before the effective date of this Act and that is pending
- 17 before a court or other governmental entity on the effective date of
- 18 this Act.
- 19 (g) Sections 1001.2531, 1001.2532, 1001.2533, 1001.2534,
- 20 and 1001.2535, Education Code, as added by this Act, apply only to
- 21 an application for, or renewal of, an instructor license submitted
- 22 to the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation on or after the
- 23 effective date of this Act. An application submitted before that
- 24 date is governed by the law in effect when the application was
- 25 submitted, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 26 purpose.
- 27 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
