## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT relating to the donation and distribution of food at public 2 3 schools. Δ BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 33.907, Education Code, is amended by 5 6 amending Subsections (b), (c), and (d) and adding Subsection (b-1) 7 to read as follows: 8 (b) A school district or open-enrollment charter school may allow a campus to elect to donate food to a nonprofit organization 9 10 through: (1) a parent of a student enrolled at the campus; or 11 (2) a person [an official of the nonprofit 12 13 organization] who is directly and officially affiliated with the campus, including a teacher  $\underline{or}[\tau]$  counselor[, or parent of a 14 student enrolled at the campus]. 15 (b-1) The donated food may be received, stored, 16 and distributed on the campus. Food donated by the campus may include: 17 (1) surplus food prepared for snacks or breakfast, 18 lunch, or dinner meals [or a snack to be] served from [at] the 19 campus cafeteria, subject to any applicable local, state, and 20 21 federal requirements; or 22 (2) food donated to the campus as the result of a food 23 drive or similar event. (c) The type of food donated under Subsection (b-1)(1) [this 24

2	(1) [ <del>packaged or unpackaged</del> ] unserved food <u>that was</u>
3	packaged by a person on campus and that was never removed from the
4	campus food serving area before the food was donated;
5	(2) packaged served food if the packaging and food are
6	[ <del>is</del> ] in good condition <u>and the temperature of the food has been</u>
7	maintained as required by law;
8	(3) whole, uncut produce; <u>and</u>
9	(4) <u>unserved</u> , wrapped raw produce <u>the temperature of</u>
10	which has been maintained as required by law[; and
11	[ <del>(5) unpeeled fruit required to be peeled before</del>
12	consumption].
13	(d) Food donated under this section to a nonprofit
14	organization may be distributed at the campus at any time. Campus
15	employees may assist in preparing and distributing the food as
16	volunteers for the nonprofit organization. <u>A person who assists in</u>
17	preparing and distributing the food as a volunteer for the
18	nonprofit organization must be trained under Subchapter D, Chapter
19	438, Health and Safety Code, or supervised by a person who has been
20	trained under that subchapter.
21	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
22	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
23	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
24	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

25 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
