7	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 79, Government Code, is
8	amended by adding Sections 79.043 and 79.044 to read as follows:
9	Sec. 79.043. ESTABLISHMENT OF PUBLIC DEFENDERS' OFFICES.
10	(a) In this section, "public defender's office" has the meaning
11	assigned by Article 26.044, Code of Criminal Procedure.
12	(b) The commission shall offer financial and technical
13	assistance to counties in the establishment, operation, and
14	oversight of public defenders' offices. The commission shall
15	provide ongoing financial assistance, as necessary, to ensure the
16	continued existence of the public defenders' offices in those
17	counties. The commission shall prioritize offering the assistance
18	described by this subsection to counties with populations of less
19	than 100,000, including assistance to regional public defenders'
20	offices that serve more than one county.
21	(c) The commission shall establish policies and standards
22	for the operation and administration of a public defender's office.

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(d) Not later than November 1 of each even-numbered year,

- 6 <u>established with the commission's assistance under this section.</u>
- 7 Sec. 79.044. REVIEW OF ATTORNEY'S FEES. The commission
- 8 shall conduct a biennial review of the schedule of fees adopted
- 9 under Article 26.05, Code of Criminal Procedure, for the payment of
- 10 attorneys appointed to represent an indigent defendant in criminal
- 11 proceedings and the total amount of fees paid by counties to those
- 12 attorneys to ensure that the attorney's fees are consistent and
- 13 fair.
- 14 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
