A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the provision of funding for indigent defense services

3 and to the representation of indigent defendants in criminal cases.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

- 5 SECTION 1. Section 79.037(a), Government Code, is amended 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (a) The commission shall:
- 8 (1) provide technical support to:
- 9 (A) assist counties in improving their <u>systems</u>
 10 <u>for providing</u> indigent defense <u>services</u>, <u>including indigent</u>
- 11 defense support services [systems]; and
- 12 (B) promote compliance by counties with the
- 13 requirements of state law relating to indigent defense;
- 14 (2) to assist a county in providing or improving the
- 15 provision of indigent defense services in the county, distribute in
- 16 the form of grants any funds appropriated for the purposes of this
- 17 section to one or more of the following entities:
- 18 (A) the county;
- 19 (B) a law school's legal clinic or program that
- 20 provides indigent defense services in the county; [and]
- (C) a regional public defender that meets the
- 22 requirements of Subsection (e) and provides indigent defense
- 23 services in the county; [and]
- (D) an entity described by Section 791.013 that

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- 1 provides to a county administrative services under an interlocal
- 2 contract entered into for the purpose of providing or improving the
- 3 provision of indigent defense services in the county; and
- 4 (E) a nonprofit corporation that provides
- 5 indigent defense services or indigent defense support services in
- 6 the county; and
- 7 (3) monitor each entity that receives a grant under
- 8 Subdivision (2) and enforce compliance with the conditions of the
- 9 grant, including enforcement by:
- 10 (A) withdrawing grant funds; or
- 11 (B) requiring reimbursement of grant funds by the

- SECTION 2. Section 79.037(b), Government Code, as amended
- 14 by Chapters 56 (S.B. 1353) and 476 (S.B. 1057), Acts of the 84th
- 15 Legislature, Regular Session, 2015, is reenacted and amended to

- 17 (b) The commission shall determine for each county the
- 18 entity or entities [within the county] that are eligible to receive
- 19 funds for the provision of or improvement in the provision of
- 20 indigent defense services under Subsection (a)(2). The
- 21 determination must be made based on the entity's:
- (1) compliance with standards adopted by the board;

- 24 (2) demonstrated commitment to compliance with the

- 3 (c) The board shall adopt policies to ensure that funds
- 4 under Subsection (a)(2) are allocated and distributed in a fair
- 5 manner.
- 6 SECTION 4. Subchapter C, Chapter 79, Government Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Sections 79.043 and 79.044 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 79.043. ESTABLISHMENT OF PUBLIC DEFENDERS' OFFICES.
- 9 (a) In this section, "public defender's office" has the meaning
- 10 assigned by Article 26.044, Code of Criminal Procedure.
- 11 (b) The commission may encourage the creation of public
- 12 defenders' offices and may offer financial and technical assistance
- 13 to counties in the establishment, operation, and oversight of
- 14 public defenders' offices. The commission may provide ongoing
- 15 <u>financial assistance to public defenders' offices, including</u>
- 16 regional public defenders' offices that serve more than one county.
- 17 (c) The commission shall establish policies and standards
- 18 for the operation and administration of a public defender's office.
- 19 (d) Not later than November 1 of each even-numbered year,
- 20 the commission shall submit to the governor and the legislature a
- 21 report that includes:
- (1) the number of public defenders' offices
- 23 established with the commission's assistance under this section;
- 24 and
- 25 (2) the number of counties that are not served by a
- 26 public defender's office.
- Sec. 79.044. REVIEW OF ATTORNEY'S FEES. The commission

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- 1 shall conduct a biennial review of the schedule of fees adopted
- 2 under Article 26.05, Code of Criminal Procedure, for the payment of
- 3 attorneys appointed to represent an indigent defendant in criminal
- 4 proceedings and the total amount of fees paid by counties to those
- 5 attorneys to ensure that the attorney's fees are consistent and
- 6 <u>fair.</u>
- 7 SECTION 5. Section 79.037(e), Government Code, as added by
- 8 Chapter 56 (S.B. 1353), Acts of the 84th Legislature, Regular
- 9 Session, 2015, is repealed.
- 10 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
