AN ACT

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 104.002, Health and Safety Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Subdivision (6) to read as follows:
- 7 (6) "Health literacy" means the degree to which
- 8 individuals have the capacity to obtain, process, and understand
- 9 basic health information and health services needed to make
- 10 appropriate health decisions.

- 11 SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 104, Health and Safety
- 12 Code, is amended by adding Section 104.0157 to read as follows:
- Sec. 104.0157. HEALTH LITERACY ADVISORY COMMITTEE. (a)
- 14 The statewide health coordinating council shall form an advisory
- 15 committee on health literacy. The advisory committee must include
- 16 representatives of interested groups, including the academic
- 17 community, consumer groups, health plans, pharmacies, and
- 18 <u>associations of physicians, hospitals, and nurses.</u>
- 19 <u>(b) The advisory committee shall develop a long-range plan</u>
- 20 for increasing health literacy in this state.
- 21 (c) In developing the long-range plan, the advisory
- 22 committee shall study the economic impact of low health literacy on
- 23 state health care programs and insurance coverage for residents of
- 24 this state. The advisory committee shall:

- 1 (1) identify key risk factors for low health literacy;
- 2 (2) examine methods for health care practitioners,
- 3 health care facilities, and others to address health literacy with
- 4 patients and the public;
- 5 (3) examine the effectiveness of using quality
- 6 measures in state health programs to improve health literacy;
- 7 (4) identify ways to expand the use of plain language
- 8 instructions for patients; and
- 9 (5) identify the ways that increasing health literacy
- 10 can improve patient safety, reduce preventable events, and increase
- 11 medication adherence to attain greater cost-effectiveness and
- 12 better patient outcomes in health care.
- 13 (d) The advisory committee shall elect a presiding officer.
- 14 (e) Members of the advisory committee serve without
- 15 compensation but are entitled to reimbursement for the members'
- 16 travel expenses as provided by Chapter 660, Government Code, and
- 17 the General Appropriations Act.
- 18 (f) Sections 2110.002, 2110.003, and 2110.008, Government
- 19 Code, do not apply to the advisory committee.
- 20 (g) Meetings of the advisory committee under this section
- 21 <u>are subject to Chapter 551, Government Code.</u>
- SECTION 3. Sections 104.022(e) and (f), Health and Safety
- 23 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- (e) The state health plan shall be developed and used in
- 25 accordance with applicable state and federal law. The plan must
- 26 identify:
- 27 (1) major statewide health concerns, including the

1 prevalence of low health literacy of health care consumers;

- 2 (2) the availability and use of current health
- 3 resources of the state, including resources associated with
- 4 information technology and state-supported institutions of higher
- 5 education; and
- 6 (3) future health service, information technology,
- 7 and facility needs of the state.
- 8 (f) The state health plan must:
- 9 (1) propose strategies for the correction of major
- 10 deficiencies in the service delivery system;
- 11 (2) propose strategies for increasing health literacy
- 12 to obtain greater cost-effectiveness and better patient outcomes in
- 13 <u>health care;</u>
- 14 (3) [(2)] propose strategies for incorporating
- 15 information technology in the service delivery system;
- 16 (4) [(3)] propose strategies for involving
- 17 state-supported institutions of higher education in providing
- 18 health services and for coordinating those efforts with health and
- 19 human services agencies in order to close gaps in services; and
- 20 (5) [(4)] provide direction for the state's
- 21 legislative and executive decision-making processes to implement
- 22 the strategies proposed by the plan.
- 23 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
