(a) The commission shall 9 appoint an advisory committee to develop an independent assessment 10 of the state's transportation infrastructure and mobility needs for 11 12 the years 2020 to 2050, including assessments of needs in the areas 13 of: 14 (1) pavement maintenance; (2) bridge maintenance; 15 16 (3) urban mobility; (4) <u>rural mobility and safety; and</u> 17 18 (5) nonhighway modes of transportation. (b) The commission shall appoint to the advisory committee 19 members to represent: 20 21 (1) diverse geographic regions of the state; 22 (2) diverse industries affected by transportation 23 infrastructure and mobility issues; and 24 (3) diverse transportation sectors.

1	(c) The advisory committee shall receive public input from
2	residents of this state by:
3	(1) holding public hearings in locations across the
4	state; and
5	(2) receiving comments through an Internet website, by
6	mail, and by other methods, if appropriate.
7	(d) Not later than September 1, 2020, the advisory committee
8	shall report the findings of the study and any recommendations to
9	the commission and to the members of the legislature.
10	(e) The committee is abolished and this section expires
11	January 1, 2021.
12	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
13	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
14	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
15	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

16 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
