A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to certain degree and internship requirements for teacher 3 certification.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 21.050, Education Code, is amended to 6 read as follows:

7 Sec. 21.050. ACADEMIC DEGREE REQUIRED FOR TEACHING CERTIFICATE[; INTERNSHIP]. [(a)] A person who applies for a 8 teaching certificate for which board rules require a bachelor's 9 degree must possess a bachelor's degree received with an education 10 major or another academic major or interdisciplinary academic 11 12 major, including reading, [other than education,] that is related 13 to the curriculum as prescribed under Subchapter A, Chapter 28.

14 [(b) The board may not require more than 18 semester credit 15 hours of education courses at the baccalaureate level for the granting of a teaching certificate. The board shall provide for a 16 minimum number of semester credit hours of internship to be 17 included in the hours needed for certification. The board may 18 propose rules requiring additional credit hours for certification 19 in bilingual education, English as a second language, early 20 childhood education, or special education. 21

22 [(c) A person who receives a bachelor's degree required for 23 a teaching certificate on the basis of higher education coursework 24 completed while receiving an exemption from tuition and fees under

Section 54.363 may not be required to participate in any field
experience or internship consisting of student teaching to receive
a teaching certificate.]
SECTION 2. Section 21.047(c), Education Code, is repealed.

5 SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2019-2020 6 school year.

7 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
