A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to peer specialists and the provision of peer services to
- 3 individuals with an intellectual or developmental disability.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 531.0999(a) and (b), Government Code,
- 6 as added by Chapter 1015 (H.B. 1486), Acts of the 85th Legislature,
- 7 Regular Session, 2017, are amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) With input from mental health, intellectual or
- 9 developmental disability, and substance use peer specialists and
- 10 the work group described by Subsection (b), the commission shall
- 11 develop and the executive commissioner shall adopt:
- 12 (1) rules that establish training requirements for
- 13 peer specialists so that they are able to provide services to
- 14 persons with a mental illness or intellectual or developmental
- 15 disability or services to persons with substance use conditions;
- 16 (2) rules that establish certification and
- 17 supervision requirements for peer specialists;
- 18 (3) rules that define the scope of services that peer
- 19 specialists may provide;
- 20 (4) rules that distinguish peer services from other
- 21 services that a person must hold a license to provide; and
- 22 (5) any other rules necessary to protect the health
- 23 and safety of persons receiving peer services.
- 24 (b) The commission shall establish a stakeholder work group

- 1 to provide input for the adoption of rules under Subsection
- 2 (a). The work group is composed of the following stakeholders
- 3 appointed by the executive commissioner:
- 4 (1) one representative of each organization that
- 5 certifies mental health, intellectual or developmental disability,
- 6 and substance use peer specialists in this state;
- 7 (2) three representatives of organizations that
- 8 employ mental health, intellectual or developmental disability,
- 9 and substance use peer specialists;
- 10 (3) one mental health peer specialist who works in an
- 11 urban area;
- 12 (4) one mental health peer specialist who works in a
- 13 rural area;
- 14 (5) one intellectual or developmental disability peer
- 15 specialist who works in an urban area;
- 16 (6) one intellectual or developmental disability peer
- 17 specialist who works in a rural area;
- 18 (7) one substance use peer specialist who works in an
- 19 urban area;
- 20 (8) (8) one substance use peer specialist who works
- 21 in a rural area;
- 22 $\underline{(9)}$ [$\overline{(7)}$] one person who trains mental health peer
- 23 specialists;
- 24 (10) one person who trains intellectual or
- 25 <u>developmental disability peer specialists;</u>
- 26 (11) [(8)] one person who trains substance use peer
- 27 specialists;

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- 1 (12) (49) three representatives of mental health and
- 2 addiction licensed health care professional groups who supervise
- 3 mental health, intellectual or developmental disability, and
- 4 substance use peer specialists;
- 5 (13) $\left[\frac{(10)}{(10)}\right]$ to the extent possible, not more than
- 6 three persons with personal experience recovering from mental
- 7 illness, substance use conditions, or co-occurring mental illness
- 8 and substance use conditions or with personal experience living
- 9 with an intellectual or developmental disability; and
- 10 (14) (14) any other persons considered appropriate
- 11 by the executive commissioner.
- 12 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 13 of this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 14 Services Commission shall adopt rules as necessary to implement the
- 15 changes in law made by this Act.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
