3	services under Medicaid.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 531, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 531.09991 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 531.09991. RECOVERY COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS. (a) In
8	this section, "recovery community organization" means a nonprofit
9	organization that mobilizes resources inside and outside of a local
10	community to increase the prevalence and quality of long-term
11	recovery for persons with substance use disorder and their family
12	members and that is wholly or partly governed by persons recovering
13	from a substance use disorder or their family members.
14	(b) The executive commissioner, with input from the work
15	group established under Subsection (c), shall adopt rules to
16	provide Medicaid reimbursement for services provided by recovery
17	community organizations, which must include:
18	(1) rules that establish training requirements for
19	recovery community organization service providers;
20	(2) rules that establish certification and
21	supervision requirements for recovery community organizations;
22	(3) rules that define the scope of services that
23	recovery community organizations may provide;
24	(4) rules that distinguish services provided by

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1	recovery community organizations from other services that a person
2	must hold a license to provide; and
3	(5) any other rules necessary to protect the health
4	and safety of persons receiving services provided by recovery
5	community organizations.
6	(c) The executive commissioner shall establish a work group
7	to provide input for the adoption of rules under Subsection (b).
8	The work group is composed of at least nine and not more than 13
9	members with expertise in substance use recovery or recovery
10	community organizations. The executive commissioner shall ensure
11	that at least half of the members in the work group are from rural
12	communities in this state.
13	(d) The executive commissioner shall appoint one member of
14	the work group to serve as presiding officer.
15	(e) The work group is automatically abolished on the
16	adoption of rules under Subsection (b).
17	(f) Subsections (c), (d), and (e) and this subsection expire
18	September 1, 2021.
19	SECTION 2. Effective January 1, 2021, Section 32.024, Human
20	Resources Code, is amended by adding Subsection (pp) to read as
21	follows:
22	(pp) The commission in its rules and standards governing the
23	scope of services provided under the medical assistance program
24	shall include services provided by recovery community
25	organizations as defined by Section 531.09991, Government Code, to
26	the extent permitted by federal law.
27	SECTION 3. Not later than December 31, 2019, the executive

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commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission shall
 establish the work group required by Section 531.09991, Government
 Code, as added by this Act.

4 SECTION 4. Not later than December 31, 2020, the executive 5 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission shall 6 adopt the rules required by Section 531.09991, Government Code, as 7 added by this Act.

8 SECTION 5. If before implementing any provision of this Act 9 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a 10 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision, 11 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or 12 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the 13 waiver or authorization is granted.

SECTION 6. Except as otherwise provided by this Act, this
Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

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
