- 21 applied for that assistance.

- 5 SECTION 4. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 6 a state agency determines that any other waiver or authorization
- 7 from a federal agency is necessary for implementation of that
- 8 provision, the agency affected by the provision shall request the
- 9 waiver or authorization and may delay implementing that provision
- 10 until the waiver or authorization is granted.
- 11 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
