## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to emergency management for cyber attacks against this

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 418.002, Government Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 418.002. PURPOSES. The purposes of this chapter are
- 8 to:
- 9 (1) reduce vulnerability of people and communities of
- 10 this state to damage, injury, and loss of life and property
- 11 resulting from natural or man-made catastrophes, riots, [or]
- 12 hostile military or paramilitary action, or cyber attacks;
- 13 (2) prepare for prompt and efficient rescue, care, and
- 14 treatment of persons victimized or threatened by disaster;
- 15 (3) provide a setting conducive to the rapid and
- 16 orderly restoration and rehabilitation of persons and property
- 17 affected by disasters;
- 18 (4) clarify and strengthen the roles of the governor,
- 19 state agencies, the judicial branch of state government, and local
- 20 governments in prevention of, preparation for, response to, and
- 21 recovery from disasters;
- 22 (5) authorize and provide for cooperation in disaster
- 23 mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery;
- 24 (6) authorize and provide for coordination of

- 1 activities relating to disaster mitigation, preparedness,
- 2 response, and recovery by agencies and officers of this state, and
- 3 similar state-local, interstate, federal-state, and foreign
- 4 activities in which the state and its political subdivisions may
- 5 participate;
- 6 (7) provide an emergency management system embodying
- 7 all aspects of predisaster preparedness and postdisaster response;
- 8 (8) assist in mitigation of disasters caused or
- 9 aggravated by inadequate planning for and regulation of public and
- 10 private facilities and land use; and
- 11 (9) provide the authority and mechanism to respond to
- 12 an energy emergency.
- 13 SECTION 2. Section 418.004, Government Code, is amended by
- 14 amending Subdivision (1) and adding Subdivision (1-a) to read as
- 15 follows:
- 16 (1) "Cyber attack" means an attempt to damage,
- 17 disrupt, or gain unauthorized access to a computer, computer
- 18 network, or computer system.
- 19 (1-a) "Disaster" means the occurrence or imminent
- 20 threat of widespread or severe damage, injury, or loss of life or
- 21 property resulting from any natural or man-made cause, including
- 22 fire, flood, earthquake, wind, storm, wave action, oil spill or
- 23 other water contamination, volcanic activity, epidemic, air
- 24 contamination, blight, drought, infestation, explosion, riot,
- 25 hostile military or paramilitary action, cyber attack, extreme
- 26 heat, other public calamity requiring emergency action, or energy
- 27 emergency.

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- 1 SECTION 3. Section 418.0195(b), Government Code, is amended
- 2 to read as follows:
- 3 (b) The governor may order the Department of Information
- 4 Resources to disconnect a computer network from the Internet in the
- 5 event of a cyber attack or other substantial external threat to the
- 6 computer network.
- 7 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
