- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 2054.1184, Government Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 2054.1184. EXECUTION CAPABILITY READINESS SCORING
- 8 [ASSESSMENT] OF MAJOR INFORMATION RESOURCES PROJECT. (a) A state
- 9 agency proposing to spend appropriated funds for a major
- 10 information resources project must first use a proven and
- 11 industry-established automated tool that collects operational and
- 12 technical information through multiple domains of measurement and
- 13 that calculates the overall [conduct an] execution capability of
- 14 the agency to implement the project [assessment] to:
- 15 (1) identify, and provide corrective action for,
- 16 vulnerabilities by domain that may affect the agency's ability to
- 17 <u>successfully implement</u> [determine the agency's capability for
- 18 implementing] the project;
- 19 (2) remove decision biases to reduce the agency's
- 20 financial risk in implementing the project; and
- 21 (3) increase the probability of the agency's
- 22 successful implementation of the project.
- 23 (b) A state agency shall submit to the department, the
- 24 quality assurance team established under Section 2054.158, and the

- 1 Legislative Budget Board a detailed report that identifies the
- 2 agency's <u>vulnerabilities</u> by <u>domain</u> [organizational strengths and
- 3 any weaknesses] that will be addressed before the agency initially
- 4 spends appropriated funds for a major information resources
- 5 project.
- 6 (c) A state agency may contract with an independent third
- 7 party to review the execution capability report prepared by the
- 8 agency [conduct the assessment] under Subsection (a) and prepare
- 9 the report described by Subsection (b).
- 10 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
