## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to a pilot program to identify and refer eligible children
3	to early childhood intervention services.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle B, Title 3, Human Resources Code, is
6	amended by adding Chapter 75 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 75. 2-1-1 DEVELOPMENTAL SCREENING PILOT PROGRAM
8	Sec. 75.0001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
9	(1) "Commission" means the Health and Human Services
10	Commission.
11	(2) "Developmental delay" has the meaning assigned by
12	Section 73.001.
13	(3) "Early childhood intervention program" means the
14	program established under Chapter 73 to provide early childhood
15	intervention services in accordance with Part C, Individuals with
16	Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) (20 U.S.C. Section 1431 et seq.).
17	(4) "Pilot program" means the 2-1-1 developmental
18	screening pilot program established under Section 75.0002.
19	(5) "2-1-1 operator" means the commission or the
20	person the commission contracts within a region of this state to
21	provide the 2-1-1 telephone number for access to human services.
22	Sec. 75.0002. 2-1-1 DEVELOPMENTAL SCREENING PILOT PROGRAM.
23	Not later than March 1, 2020, the commission shall develop and

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implement a pilot program under which a 2-1-1 operator:

1	(1) offers and provides to the child of a consenting
2	parent or guardian who contacts the 2-1-1 operator a developmental
3	screening if the child is under three years of age; and
4	(2) if the developmental screening indicates the child
5	is at moderate to high risk of having a developmental delay or has a
6	medically diagnosed physical or mental condition that has a high
7	probability of resulting in a developmental disability, refers the
8	child to the early childhood intervention program.
9	Sec. 75.0003. LOCATION OF PILOT PROGRAM; SELECTION OF 2-1-1
10	OPERATOR. The commission shall implement the pilot program in one
11	service region or county in this state. The region or county in
12	which the pilot program is implemented must:
13	(1) contain at least one provider authorized to
14	provide services under the early childhood intervention program;
15	(2) have experienced a loss of providers under the
16	early childhood intervention program, as determined by the
17	commission; and
18	(3) be served by a 2-1-1 operator that:
19	(A) volunteers to administer the pilot program;
20	<u>and</u>
21	(B) has an existing relationship with at least
22	one of the authorized providers under the early childhood
23	intervention program.
24	Sec. 75.0004. SUPPORT OF COMMISSION. The commission shall
25	support the 2-1-1 operator selected to administer the pilot program
26	in any capacity necessary, including by:
27	(1) modifying the scripts used by individuals employed

- 1 by the 2-1-1 operator to answer calls made to the telephone number
- 2 in order to accurately identify children eligible for the
- 3 developmental screening under the pilot program;
- 4 (2) providing appropriate training to individuals
- 5 described by Subdivision (1) to identify children eligible for the
- 6 developmental screening under the pilot program;
- 7 (3) making the ability to request a developmental
- 8 screening available on the selected 2-1-1 operator's Internet
- 9 website; and
- 10 (4) providing information to the 2-1-1 operator
- 11 necessary to enable the operator to make referrals to the early
- 12 childhood intervention program.
- Sec. 75.0005. REPORT. Not later than January 1, 2021, the
- 14 commission shall conduct an evaluation of the pilot program and
- 15 <u>submit a report to the legislature. The report must:</u>
- (1) evaluate the operation of the pilot program;
- 17 (2) detail the number and demographic characteristics
- 18 of children:
- 19 (A) screened and referred to the early childhood
- 20 intervention program under the pilot program; and
- 21 (B) receiving services under the early childhood
- 22 intervention program as a result of having been referred to that
- 23 program under the pilot program; and
- 24 (3) make recommendations regarding the continuation
- 25 or expansion of the program.
- Sec. 74.0006. EXPIRATION. This chapter expires September
- 27 1, 2023.

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- SECTION 2. If before implementing any provision of this Act a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization, including an amendment to the state plan for the child health plan program under Chapter 62, Health and Safety Code, from a federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision, the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the waiver or authorization is granted.
- 9 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
