## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to the duties of the Texas School Safety Center and school
- 3 districts regarding public school safety and security.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 11.159, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Subsection (e) to read as follows:
- 7 (e) The State Board of Education shall require a trustee to
- 8 complete the online training provided by the Texas School Safety
- 9 Center on school safety and security under Section 37.205 not later
- 10 than the 30th day after the trustee's election or appointment.
- 11 SECTION 2. Section 37.0812, Education Code, is amended to
- 12 read as follows:
- 13 Sec. 37.0812. TRAINING POLICY: SCHOOL DISTRICT PEACE
- 14 OFFICERS AND SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS. A school district [with an
- 15 enrollment of 30,000 or more students] that commissions a school
- 16 district peace officer or at which a school resource officer
- 17 provides law enforcement shall adopt a policy requiring the officer
- 18 to complete the education and training program required by Section
- 19 1701.263, Occupations Code.
- SECTION 3. Sections 37.108(a), (b), and (c), Education
- 21 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 22 (a) Each school district or public junior college district
- 23 shall adopt and implement a multihazard emergency operations plan
- 24 for use in the district's facilities. The plan must address

- 1 mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery as defined by the
- 2 commissioner of education or commissioner of higher education in
- 3 conjunction with the governor's office of homeland security. The
- 4 plan must provide for:
- 5 (1) district employee training in responding to an
- 6 emergency;
- 7 (2) if the plan applies to a school district:
- 8 (A)  $[\tau]$  mandatory school drills and exercises to
- 9 prepare district students and employees for responding to an
- 10 emergency; and
- 11 (B) establishment of memoranda of understanding
- 12 or mutual aid agreements with entities identified in accordance
- 13 with Section 37.2121(a) that comply with the guidelines developed
- 14 by the Texas School Safety Center under Section 37.2121(b);
- 15 (3) measures to ensure coordination with the
- 16 Department of State Health Services and local emergency management
- 17 agencies, law enforcement, health departments, and fire
- 18 departments in the event of an emergency; and
- 19 (4) the implementation of a safety and security audit
- 20 as required by Subsection (b).
- 21 (b) At least once every <u>two</u> [three] years, each school
- 22 district or public junior college district shall conduct a safety
- 23 and security audit of the district's facilities. To the extent
- 24 possible, a district shall follow safety and security audit
- 25 procedures developed by the Texas School Safety Center or a
- 26 comparable public or private entity.
- 27 (c) A school district or public junior college district

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- 1 shall report the results of the safety and security audit conducted
- 2 under Subsection (b) to the district's board of trustees and, in the
- 3 manner required by the Texas School Safety Center, to the Texas
- 4 School Safety Center. The report provided under this subsection
- 5 must include the information required by Section 37.2121(d)
- 6 regarding each memorandum of understanding or mutual aid agreement
- 7 entered into by the district addressing school safety and security.
- 8 SECTION 4. Section 37.205, Education Code, is amended to
- 9 read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 37.205. SAFETY TRAINING PROGRAMS. The center shall
- 11 conduct for school districts a safety training program that
- 12 includes:
- 13 (1) development of a positive school environment and
- 14 proactive safety measures designed to address local concerns;
- 15 (2) school safety courses for law enforcement
- 16 officials, with a focus on school district police officers and
- 17 school resource officers;
- 18 (3) discussion of school safety issues with parents
- 19 and community members; [and]
- 20 (4) assistance in developing a multihazard emergency
- 21 operations plan for adoption under Section 37.108;
- 22 (5) courses and other training materials and resources
- 23 for school counselors regarding the role of student mental health
- 24 in providing a safe school environment; and
- 25 (6) an online training course for members of a school
- 26 district board of trustees that includes information regarding:
- 27 (A) a trustee's responsibilities for school

- 1 safety and security; and
- 2 (B) the resources available from the center to
- 3 assist districts with school safety and security.
- 4 SECTION 5. Section 37.207(b), Education Code, is amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 (b) Each school district shall report the results of its
- 7 audits and the information required by Section 37.2121(d) to the
- 8 center in the manner required by the center.
- 9 SECTION 6. Subchapter G, Chapter 37, Education Code, is
- 10 amended by adding Sections 37.2071 and 37.2072 to read as follows:
- Sec. 37.2071. SAFETY AND SECURITY AUDIT REVIEW. (a) The
- 12 center shall review the results of each school district's audit and
- 13 determine if a school district is:
- 14 (1) using best practices regarding the safety and
- 15 security of district facilities; and
- 16 (2) complying with all applicable standards.
- 17 (b) If the center makes a determination under Subsection (a)
- 18 that a school district is not using best practices or is not in
- 19 compliance with applicable standards, the center shall:
- 20 (1) notify the district and provide specific
- 21 information explaining the reasons for the center's determination;
- 22 (2) provide recommendations for the improvement of the
- 23 district's facilities; and
- 24 (3) provide technical and on-site assistance to the
- 25 district in making improvements.
- 26 (c) If a school district has, within the previous four
- 27 years, failed to comply with applicable standards, as determined by

- 1 the center under Subsection (a)(2), the center may:
- 2 (1) conduct periodic on-site visits to ensure the
- 3 district is making necessary changes; and
- 4 (2) provide recommendations to the district for
- 5 further improvement.
- 6 Sec. 37.2072. STUDY ON AVAILABILITY OF SCHOOL SAFETY AND
- 7 SECURITY INFORMATION. (a) The center shall conduct a study to
- 8 determine the appropriate method for a school district to provide
- 9 the district's safety and security standards and plans to a student
- 10 or a student's parent or guardian without exposing the district's
- 11 security vulnerabilities or any confidential details.
- 12 (b) Not later than September 1, 2020, the center shall
- 13 submit a report to the legislature that includes the results of the
- 14 study and any recommendations for legislative or other action.
- (c) This section expires September 1, 2021.
- SECTION 7. Section 37.2121, Education Code, is amended by
- 17 amending Subsection (d) and adding Subsection (d-1) to read as
- 18 follows:
- 19 (d) Each school district shall include with the district's
- 20 safety and security audit report required by Section 37.108(c), or
- 21 provide at any time requested by the center, information regarding
- 22 any [that enters into a] memorandum of understanding or mutual aid
- 23 agreement <u>adopted by the district</u> addressing [<del>issues that affect</del>]
- 24 school safety and security. The report must include [shall, at the
- 25 center's request, provide] the following information [to the
- 26 <del>center</del>]:
- 27 (1) the name of each entity with which the school

- 1 district has entered into a memorandum of understanding or mutual
- 2 aid agreement;
- 3 (2) the effective date of each memorandum or
- 4 agreement; and
- 5 (3) a summary of each memorandum or agreement.
- 6 (d-1) If, based on information provided by a school district
- 7 under Subsection (d), the center determines that a school district
- 8 has not entered into an appropriate memorandum of understanding or
- 9 mutual aid agreement with entities identified in accordance with
- 10 Subsection (a) that complies with the guidelines developed under
- 11 Subsection (b), the center shall notify the district and assist the
- 12 district in establishing an appropriate memorandum of
- 13 understanding or mutual aid agreement.
- 14 SECTION 8. Section 1701.263(b), Occupations Code, is
- 15 amended to read as follows:
- 16 (b) The commission by rule shall require a school district
- 17 peace officer or a school resource officer who is commissioned by or
- 18 who provides law enforcement at a school district [with an
- 19 enrollment of 30,000 or more students] to successfully complete an
- 20 education and training program described by this section before or
- 21 within 120 days of the officer's commission by or placement in the
- 22 district or a campus of the district. The program must:
- 23 (1) consist of at least 16 hours of training;
- 24 (2) be approved by the commission; and
- 25 (3) provide training in accordance with the curriculum
- 26 developed under Section 1701.262 in each subject area listed in
- 27 Subsection (c) of that section.

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- 1 SECTION 9. Section 37.2121(c), Education Code, is repealed.
- 2 SECTION 10. (a) As soon as practicable after the effective
- 3 date of this Act, the Texas School Safety Center shall develop and
- 4 make available the online training course for members of a school
- 5 district board of trustees as required by Section 37.205, Education
- 6 Code, as amended by this Act.
- 7 (b) A person elected or appointed to the board of trustees
- 8 of a school district on a date occurring before the online training
- 9 course is made available must complete the training required by
- 10 Section 11.159(e), Education Code, as added by this Act, not later
- 11 than the 30th day after the date on which the Texas School Safety
- 12 Center makes the online training course available.
- SECTION 11. (a) Notwithstanding Section 1701.263(b),
- 14 Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, a school district peace
- 15 officer or school resource officer who commences employment with or
- 16 commences providing law enforcement at a school district with an
- 17 enrollment of fewer than 30,000 students on a date occurring before
- 18 September 1, 2019, shall complete the training required by Section
- 19 1701.263, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, as soon as
- 20 practicable and not later than August 31, 2020. This subsection
- 21 does not apply to an officer who is exempt from the training
- 22 established under Section 1701.263, Occupations Code, as amended by
- 23 this Act, because the officer has completed the training described
- 24 by Subsection (b-1) of that section.
- 25 (b) Not later than October 1, 2019, a school district with
- 26 an enrollment of fewer than 30,000 students shall adopt the
- 27 training policy for school district peace officers and school

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- 1 resource officers required by Section 37.0812, Education Code, as
- 2 amended by this Act.
- 3 SECTION 12. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
