12	ASSISTANTS. (a) In a licensed hospital or ambulatory surgical
13	center, a supervising physician who is an anesthesiologist may
14	delegate the administration and provision of an anesthetic or an
15	anesthesia-related service ordered by the supervising physician to
16	an anesthesiologist assistant who:
17	(1) has passed the Certifying Examination for
18	Anesthesiologist Assistants administered by the National
19	Commission for Certification of Anesthesiologist Assistants or the
20	commission's successor entity; and
21	(2) holds a certificate issued by the National
22	Commission for Certification of Anesthesiologist Assistants or the

commission's successor entity.
