5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Chapter 552, Health and Safety Code, is amended
7	by adding Subchapter E to read as follows:
8	SUBCHAPTER E. STATE HOSPITAL OPERATIONS
9	Sec. 552.151. TRANSITION PLANNING FOR CONTRACTED
10	OPERATIONS OF A CERTAIN STATE HOSPITAL. The commission shall
11	establish a plan under which the commission may contract with a
12	local public institution of higher education to transfer the
13	operations of Austin State Hospital from the commission to a local
14	<pre>public institution of higher education.</pre>
15	Sec. 552.152. PLAN REQUIREMENTS. (a) In developing the
16	<pre>plan, the commission shall:</pre>
17	(1) consult with local public institutions of higher
18	education;
19	(2) establish procedures and policies to ensure that a
20	local public institution of higher education that contracts with
21	the commission to operate Austin State Hospital operates the
22	hospital at a quality level at least equal to the quality level
23	achieved by the commission; and
24	(3) establish procedures and policies to monitor the

- 1 care of affected state hospital patients.
- 2 (b) The procedures and policies required to be established
- 3 under Subsection (a) must ensure that the commission is able to
- 4 obtain and maintain information on activities carried out under the
- 5 contract without violating privacy or confidentiality rules. The
- 6 procedures and policies must account for the commission obtaining
- 7 and maintaining information on:
- 8 <u>(1) client outcomes;</u>
- 9 (2) individual and average lengths of stay, including
- 10 computation of lengths of stay according to the number of days a
- 11 patient is in the facility during each calendar year, regardless of
- 12 discharge and readmission;
- 13 (3) the number of incidents in which patients were
- 14 restrained or secluded;
- 15 (4) the number of incidents of serious assaults in the
- 16 hospital setting; and
- 17 (5) the number of occurrences in the hospital setting
- 18 involving contacts with law enforcement personnel.
- 19 Sec. 552.153. REPORT. Not later than September 1, 2020, the
- 20 commission shall prepare and deliver to the governor, the
- 21 lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives,
- 22 and the legislature a written report containing the plan and any
- 23 recommendations for <u>legislation or other actions necessary.</u>
- 24 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
