15	Sec. 552.152. PLAN REQUIREMENTS. (a) In developing the									
16	plan, the commission shall:									
17	(1) consult with local public institutions of higher									
18	education;									
19	(2) establish procedures and policies to ensure that a									
20	local public institution of higher education that contracts with									
21	the commission to operate Austin State Hospital operates the									
22	hospital at a quality level at least equal to the quality level									
23	achieved by the commission; and									
24	(3) establish procedures and policies to monitor the									

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care of affected state hospital patients. 1 2 (b) The procedures and policies required to be established under Subsection (a) must ensure that the commission is able to 3 obtain and maintain information on activities carried out under the 4 contract without violating privacy or confidentiality rules. 5 The procedures and policies must account for the commission obtaining 6 7 and maintaining information on: 8 client outcomes; 9 (2) individual and average lengths of stay, including computation of lengths of stay according to the number of days a 10 11 patient is in the facility during each calendar year, regardless of 12 discharge and readmission; 13 (3) the number of incidents in which patients were restrained or secluded; 14 15 (4) the number of incidents of serious assaults in the 16 hospital setting; and 17 (5) the number of occurrences in the hospital setting 18 involving contacts with law enforcement personnel. Sec. 552.153. REPORT. Not later than September 1, 2020, the 19 20 commission shall prepare and deliver to the governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives, 21 22 and the legislature a written report containing the plan and any recommendations for legislation or other actions necessary. 23 24 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
