## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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| 2  | relating to a border operations training program for peace officers |

| 4  | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:             |
| 5  | SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 411, Government Code, is           |
| 6  | amended by adding Section 411.02096 to read as follows:             |
| 7  | Sec. 411.02096. BORDER OPERATIONS TRAINING PROGRAM;                 |
| 8  | COMMISSION. (a) The department, in coordination with local law      |
| 9  | enforcement agencies, shall establish and administer a border       |
| 10 | operations training program for peace officers employed by local    |
| 11 | law enforcement agencies that will prepare the officers to:         |
| 12 | (1) collaborate and cooperate with and assist any law               |
| 13 | enforcement agency in the interdiction, investigation, and          |
| 14 | prosecution of criminal activity in the Texas-Mexico border region; |
| 15 | <u>and</u>  |
| 16 | (2) collaborate and cooperate with and assist district              |
| 17 | attorneys, county attorneys, the border prosecution unit, and other |
| 18 | prosecutors in the investigation and prosecution of allegations of  |
| 19 | criminal activity in the Texas-Mexico border region.                |
| 20 | (b) The training program under Subsection (a) must include:         |
| 21 | (1) information on:   |
| 22 | (A) criminal activity occurring along the                           |
| 23 | Texas-Mexico border, including drug trafficking and trafficking of  |
| 24 | persons and other activity carried out by cartels, transnational    |

- 1 gangs, and other groups engaged in organized criminal activity; and
- 2 (B) methods for identifying northbound,
- 3 southbound, and intrastate criminal activity associated with drug
- 4 trafficking, trafficking of persons, and other organized criminal
- 5 activity;
- 6 (2) best practices for investigating and prosecuting
- 7 the criminal activity described by Subdivision (1) and securing the
- 8 Texas-Mexico border; and
- 9 (3) an overview of the department's operations at the
- 10 Texas-Mexico border, including any collaboration with the United
- 11 States Customs and Border Protection.
- 12 <u>(c)</u> The department shall identify opportunities for a peace
- 13 officer described by Subsection (a) to assist in the department's
- 14 <u>duties related to border operations</u>. The department may authorize
- 15 the officer to assist in carrying out those duties.
- 16 (d) A peace officer authorized by the department to assist
- 17 in carrying out duties related to the department's border
- 18 operations as described by Subsection (c) is not entitled to
- 19 compensation from the department for the assistance provided.
- (e) The department may partner with federal agencies in
- 21 administering the training program under Subsection (a) and
- 22 facilitating any assistance provided by a peace officer under
- 23 Subsection (c).
- SECTION 2. Subchapter H, Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, is
- 25 amended by adding Section 1701.359 to read as follows:
- Sec. 1701.359. BORDER OPERATIONS TRAINING PROGRAM. The
- 27 commission may:

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- 1 (1) recognize, or with the consent of the Department
- 2 of Public Safety administer or assist in administering, the border
- 3 operations training program established under Section 411.02096,
- 4 Government Code, as a continuing education program for officers;
- 5 and
- 6 (2) credit an officer who successfully completes the
- 7 program described by Subdivision (1) with the appropriate number of
- 8 continuing education hours.
- 9 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
