- 6 SECTION 1. Section 17.47(c), Business & Commerce Code, is 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (c) In addition to the request for a temporary restraining
- 9 order, or permanent injunction in a proceeding brought under
- 10 Subsection (a) of this section, the consumer protection division
- 11 may request, and the trier of fact may award, a civil penalty to be
- 12 paid to the state in an amount of:
- 13 (1) not more than \$10,000 [\$20,000] per violation; and
- 14 (2) if the act or practice that is the subject of the
- 15 proceeding was calculated to acquire or deprive money or other
- 16 property from a consumer who was 65 years of age or older when the
- 17 act or practice occurred, an additional amount of not more than
- 18 \$250,000.
- 19 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 20 an action filed by the consumer protection division under Section
- 21 17.47, Business & Commerce Code, on or after the effective date of
- 22 this Act. An action filed by the consumer protection division under
- 23 Section 17.47, Business & Commerce Code, before the effective date
- 24 of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the action

- 1 is filed, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 2 purpose.
- 3 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
