6 SECTION 1. Section 17.47(c), Business & Commerce Code, is 7 amended to read as follows:

8 (c) In addition to the request for a temporary restraining order, or permanent injunction in a proceeding brought under 9 10 Subsection (a) of this section, the consumer protection division may request, and the trier of fact may award, a civil penalty to be 11 paid to the state in an amount of: 12

(1)not more than \$10,000 [\$20,000] per violation; and 14 if the act or practice that is the subject of the (2) 15 proceeding was calculated to acquire or deprive money or other property from a consumer who was 65 years of age or older when the 16 act or practice occurred, an additional amount of not more than 17 \$250,000. 18

19 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to an action filed by the consumer protection division under Section 20 17.47, Business & Commerce Code, on or after the effective date of 21 22 this Act. An action filed by the consumer protection division under Section 17.47, Business & Commerce Code, before the effective date 23 24 of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the action
