4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 545, Transportation Code,
6	is amended by adding Section 545.1531 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 545.1531. STOP SIGN CONSIDERED YIELD SIGN IN CERTAIN
8	CIRCUMSTANCES. (a) The provisions of Sections 544.010 and
9	545.151(a) applicable to stop signs do not apply to the operator of
10	a vehicle approaching an intersection with a stop sign and no other
11	traffic-control signal or police officer directing traffic, if:
12	(1) no pedestrian is in the intersection; and
13	(2) no vehicle on the other street or roadway is in the
14	intersection or approaching the intersection in such proximity as
15	to be a hazard.
16	(b) A person operating a vehicle and approaching an
17	intersection as described by Subsection (a) shall:
18	(1) when approaching the intersection, slow to a speed
19	that is reasonable under existing conditions, not to exceed 10
20	miles per hour; and
21	(2) comply with the provisions of Section 545.153
22	applicable to yield signs when approaching the intersection.
23	SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
24	an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. An

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offense committed before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense was committed before that date.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

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
