A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to the administration of the Jobs and Education for Texans
- 3 (JET) Grant Program.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 134.004, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:
- 7 (c) In awarding grants under this chapter, the commission,
- 8 to the extent feasible, shall distribute grants equally across
- 9 geographic areas of this state.
- 10 SECTION 2. Section 134.007, Education Code, is amended to
- 11 read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 134.007. GRANTS AWARDED TO INDEPENDENT SCHOOL
- 13 DISTRICT. (a) The commission may award a grant to an independent
- 14 school district under this chapter if the district has entered into
- 15 a partnership with a public junior college, public technical
- 16 institute, or public state college for the purpose of:
- 17 (1) promoting career and technical education to the
- 18 district's students; or
- 19 (2) offering dual credit courses to the district's
- 20 students.
- 21 (b) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), an independent school
- 22 district located in a rural area of this state in which no public
- 23 junior college, public technical institute, or public state college
- 24 is located in close geographic proximity to the district may be

- 1 awarded a grant under this chapter to provide career and technical
- 2 education courses or programs to students in the district in
- 3 partnership with a local manufacturing facility in the area. The
- 4 commission shall adopt rules for the administration of this
- 5 <u>subsection</u>.
- 6 SECTION 3. Chapter 134, Education Code, is amended by
- 7 adding Section 134.009 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 134.009. BIENNIAL REPORT. (a) Not later than
- 9 November 1 of each even-numbered year, the commission shall prepare
- 10 and submit to each standing legislative committee with primary
- 11 jurisdiction over workforce development or higher education a
- 12 report regarding the grant activities and grant recipients under
- 13 this chapter, including the results and outcomes of grants awarded
- 14 under this chapter.
- 15 (b) The report must:
- 16 (1) identify high-demand occupations in this state and
- 17 evaluate how grants awarded under this chapter have been used to
- 18 support courses or programs that prepare students for employment in
- 19 those occupations; and
- 20 (2) include the following data for the most recent
- 21 two-year period for which the information is available,
- 22 disaggregated by appropriate region as determined by the
- 23 commission:
- (A) the number of students receiving career and
- 25 technical education funded by grants awarded under this chapter;
- 26 (B) the number of students attaining a
- 27 certificate, a degree, or an industry certification or other

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- 1 workforce credential as a result of receiving career and technical
- 2 education funded by grants awarded under this chapter;
- 3 (C) the number of students entering the workforce
- 4 who received career and technical education funded by grants
- 5 <u>awarded under this chapter; and</u>
- 6 (D) any losses or gains in manufacturing jobs and
- 7 the effect of those losses or gains on workforce education needs.
- 8 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
