	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1	AN ACT
2	relating to the safe and efficient provision of pilot services by
3	the Board of Pilot Commissioners for Harris County Ports.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 5007.209(b), Special District Local Laws
6	Code, is amended to read as follows:
7	(b) The training program must provide the person with
8	information regarding:
9	(1) the legislation that created the authority;
10	(2) the programs, functions, policies, rules, and
11	budget of the authority;
12	(3) the results of the most recent formal audit of the
13	authority;

- 14 (4) [the duties of the port commission as the board of
- 15 pilot commissioners for Harris County ports under Chapter 66,
- 16 Transportation Code;
- 17 [(5)] the requirements of laws relating to open
- 18 meetings, public information, administrative procedure, financial
- 19 disclosure, and conflicts of interest; and
- 20 (5)[(6)] any applicable ethics policies adopted by the
- 21 port commission or the Texas Ethics Commission.
- 22 SECTION 2. Section 66.002, Transportation Code, is amended
- 23 by adding Subsections (6-a) and (6-b), to read as follows:
- 24 (6-a) "Two-way route" means a directional route within

- 1 defined limits inside which two-way traffic is established, and
- 2 which is intended to improve safety in waters where navigation is
- 3 difficult.
- 4 (6-b) "Two-way traffic" means that traffic flow is
- 5 permitted in opposing directions, but a vessel may not meet, cross,
- 6 nor overtake any other vessel in such a manner that it would be
- 7 abreast of more than one other vessel within the defined limits of a
- 8 waterway.
- 9 SECTION 3. Section 66.017, Transportation Code, is amended
- 10 to read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 66.017. DUTIES. The board shall:
- 12 (1) establish the number of pilots necessary to
- 13 provide adequate pilot services for each Harris County port;
- 14 (2) accept applications for pilot licenses and
- 15 certificates and determine whether each applicant meets the
- 16 qualifications for a pilot;
- 17 (3) submit to the governor lists of applicants the
- 18 board finds to be qualified for appointment as pilots;
- 19 (4) establish pilotage rates;
- 20 (5) approve the locations for pilot stations;
- 21 (6) establish times during which pilot services will
- 22 be available;
- 23 (7) hear and determine complaints relating to the
- 24 conduct of pilots;
- 25 (8) recommend to the governor each pilot whose license
- 26 or certificate should not be renewed or should be revoked;
- 27 (9) adopt rules and issue orders to pilots or vessels

- 1 when necessary to secure safe and efficient pilot services,
- 2 including minimizing the interference of two-way routes;
- 3 (10) institute investigations or hearings or both to
- 4 consider casualties, accidents, or other actions that violate this
- 5 chapter; and
- 6 (11) provide penalties to be imposed on a person who is
- 7 not a pilot for a Harris County port who pilots a vessel into or out
- 8 of the port if a pilot offered those services to the vessel.
- 9 SECTION 4. Subchapter B, Chapter 66, Transportation Code,
- 10 is amended by adding Section 66.0171 to read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 66.0171. EFFICIENT PILOT SERVICE; MAXIMUM VESSEL
- 12 LENGTH. (a) Except as provided by subsection (b), in order to
- 13 ensure safe and efficient pilot services, the maximum overall
- 14 length of a vessel, including the bulbous bow, that may be piloted
- 15 within the board's jurisdiction is 1,100 ft.
- 16 (b) The board may issue rules authorizing the piloting of
- 17 vessels with a maximum overall length that exceeds the length
- 18 provided for in subsection (a) if the board determines, upon
- 19 recommendation form an association representing no less than fifty
- 20 percent of the pilots authorized to operate under the board's
- 21 jurisdiction, that two-way routes may safely and efficiently be
- 22 maintained and that two-way traffic safely and efficiently be
- 23 <u>conducted.</u>
- 24 <u>(c) Any rules adopted under subsection (b) must establish</u>
- 25 the maximum overall vessel length that may be piloted in a manner
- 26 that maintains safe and efficient two-way routes and safe and
- 27 efficient two-way traffic as recommended by an association

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- 1 representing no less than fifty percent of the pilots authorized to
- 2 operate under the board's jurisdiction.
- 3 (d) Prior to issuing any rules under subsection (b), the
- 4 board must conduct at least two public hearings
- 5 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
