SECTION 3. (a) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall adopt the rules required by Section 54.353(f), 2-12 Education Code, as amended by this Act, as soon as practicable after 2-13 2-14 the effective date of this Act.

2**-**15 2**-**16 (b) Section 54.353, Education Code, as amended by this Act, applies beginning with tuition and laboratory fees charged for the 2019 fall semester. Tuition and laboratory fees charged for an 2-17 academic period before that semester are covered by the law in 2-18 effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. 2-19 2-20 2-21

SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 2-22 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 2-23 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 2-24 2-25 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

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
