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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the inclusion of school climate in the indicators for evaluating the performance of public schools. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Section 39.053(c), Education Code, as amended by Chapters 807 (H.B. 22), 842 (H.B. 2223), and 1088 (H.B. 3593), Acts 6 7 of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017, is reenacted and amended to read as follows: 8 9 (c) School districts and campuses must be evaluated based on three domains of indicators of achievement adopted under this 10 11 section that include: 12 (1)in the student achievement domain, indicators of 13 student achievement that must include: 14 (A) for evaluating the performance of districts and campuses generally: 15 (i) an indicator that accounts for the 16 instruments required under 17 results of assessment Sections 39.023(a), (c), and (l), as applicable for the district and campus, 18 including the results of assessment instruments required for 19 graduation retaken by a student, aggregated across grade levels by 20 21 subject area, including: 22 (a) for the performance standard 23 determined by the commissioner under Section 39.0241(a), the percentage of students who performed satisfactorily on 24 the

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3 (b) for the college readiness 4 performance standard as determined under Section 39.0241, the 5 percentage of students who performed satisfactorily on the 6 assessment instruments, aggregated across grade levels by subject 7 area; and

an indicator that accounts for the 8 (ii) results of assessment instruments required under Section 9 10 39.023(b), as applicable for the district and campus, including the percentage of students who performed satisfactorily on the 11 12 assessment instruments, as determined by the performance standard adopted by the agency, aggregated across grade levels by subject 13 14 area; and

15 (B) for evaluating the performance of high school 16 campuses and districts that include high school campuses, 17 indicators that account for:

(i) students who satisfy the Texas Success Initiative (TSI) college readiness benchmarks prescribed by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board under Section 51.334 on an assessment instrument in reading or mathematics designated by the coordinating board under that section;

23 (ii) students who satisfy relevant 24 performance standards on advanced placement tests or similar 25 assessments;

No. 2302 1 (iv) students who enlist in the armed 2 forces of the United States; 3 (v) students who earn industry certifications; 4 5 (vi) students admitted into postsecondary industry certification programs that require as a prerequisite for 6 7 entrance successful performance at the secondary level; 8 (vii) students whose successful completion of a course or courses under Section 28.014 indicates the student's 9 preparation to enroll and succeed, without remediation, in an 10 entry-level general education course for a baccalaureate degree or 11 12 associate degree; (viii) 13 students who successfully met 14 standards on a composite of indicators that through research 15 indicates the student's preparation to enroll and succeed, without remediation, in an entry-level general education course for a 16 baccalaureate degree or associate degree; 17 (ix) high school graduation rates, computed 18 in accordance with standards and definitions adopted in compliance 19 with the Every Student Succeeds Act (20 U.S.C. Section 6301 et seq.) 20 subject to the exclusions provided by Subsections (g), (g-1), 21 (g-2), and (g-3); 22 23 (x) students who successfully completed an 24 OnRamps dual enrollment course; [and] 25 (xi) [the percentage of] students who 26 successfully completed a practicum or internship approved by the State Board of Education; and 27

No. 2302 1 (xii) students who are awarded an associate 2 [associate's] degree; 3 (2) in the school progress domain, indicators for effectiveness in promoting student learning, which must include: 4 5 (A) for assessment instruments, including assessment instruments under Subdivisions (1)(A)(i) and (ii), the 6 percentage of students who met the standard for improvement, as 7 8 determined by the commissioner; and 9 (B) for evaluating relative performance, the 10 performance of districts and campuses compared to similar districts or campuses; and 11 12 (3) in the closing the gaps domain: 13 (A) $[\tau]$ the use of disaggregated data to 14 demonstrate the differentials among students from different racial 15 and ethnic groups, socioeconomic backgrounds, and other factors, 16 including: 17 (i) [(A)] students formerly receiving special education services; 18 19 (ii) [(B)] students continuously enrolled; 20 and 21 (iii) [(C)] students who are mobile; and (B) the use of local evaluations, as provided by 2.2 Section 39.0545, to demonstrate differential performance ratings 23 24 among districts and campuses in school climate. 25 SECTION 2. Subchapter C, Chapter 39, Education Code, is 26 amended by adding Section 39.0545 to read as follows: 27 Sec. 39.0545. EVALUATION OF SCHOOL CLIMATE AS COMPONENT OF

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OVERALL DISTRICT AND CAMPUS RATING. (a) For purposes of including the local evaluation of districts and campuses under Section 39.053(c)(3)(B) and assigning an overall rating under Section 39.054, the commissioner by rule shall adopt a method that is based on recognized research and national standards to evaluate the school climate of school districts and campuses.

7 (b) Using the method adopted by the commissioner under 8 Subsection (a) to evaluate school climate, each school district 9 shall assign the district and each campus shall assign the campus a 10 school climate performance rating of exemplary, recognized, 11 acceptable, or needs improvement.

12 (c) On or before the date determined by the commissioner by 13 rule, each school district and campus shall report the school 14 climate performance rating to the agency for the purpose of 15 including the rating in evaluating school district and campus 16 performance and assigning an overall rating under Section 39.054.

17 SECTION 3. As soon as practicable, the commissioner of 18 education shall adopt a method to evaluate the school climate of 19 school districts and campuses as provided by Section 39.0545, 20 Education Code, as added by this Act.

21 SECTION 4. To the extent of any conflict, this Act prevails 22 over another Act of the 86th Legislature, Regular Session, 2019, 23 relating to nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in enacted 24 codes.

25 SECTION 5. This Act applies beginning with the 2019-2020 26 school year.

27 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

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a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
