4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 61, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 61.0767 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 61.0767. PRINCIPAL PREPARATION GRANT PROGRAM. (a)
8	The board shall establish and administer the principal preparation
9	grant program to provide grants to schools of education at
10	institutions of higher education and non-degree granting
11	organizations to provide funding to develop, support, or expand and
12	administer innovative principal preparation programs.
13	(b) In awarding grants under this section, the board shall
14	give priority to programs that demonstrate:
15	(1) a defined competency framework, including the set
16	of skills, knowledge, and disposition required of a principal to
17	drive high levels of student achievement for all children;
18	(2) a strategic, proactive, and targeted recruitment
19	and admission strategy that reflects the competency framework
20	described in Subdivision (1);
21	(3) highly selective, clear criteria and rigorous
22	processes to evaluate a principal preparation program applicant's
23	disposition, skills, and knowledge;
24	(4) experiential training and development;

1	(5) ongoing support for principals who graduate from
2	the program to help the principal transition and grow on the job;
3	(6) a commitment to continuous improvement and use of
4	data to assess the effectiveness of the program and principals who
5	complete the program; and
6	(7) any additional reasonable criteria prescribed by
7	board rule.
8	(c) A grant provided under this section must be used for:
9	(1) financial aid for participants in the principal
10	preparation program;
11	(2) rigorous assessment of principal preparation
12	program applicants through leadership simulation experiences rated
13	by trained assessors;
14	(3) the acquisition and use of technology by the
15	institution or organization to support measures of competency in
16	the field for principal preparation program participants;
17	(4) recruiting, hiring, and training educational
18	leaders to provide ongoing support to principal preparation program
19	participants on-site during a participant's residency;
20	(5) hiring experts to design and instruct in select
21	areas of the principal preparation program; and
22	(6) other permissible uses as determined by the board.
23	(d) The legislature may appropriate money for purposes of
24	this section. The board may solicit and accept gifts, grants, and
25	donations from any public or private source for purposes of this
26	section.
27	(e) The board shall adopt rules for the administration of

- 1 this section, including rules for governing applications for
- 2 grants, establishing procedures and criteria for evaluating
- 3 applications and awarding grants, and verifying that grant funds
- 4 awarded under this section are used appropriately.
- 5 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
