- 21 A utility is required to update this report within 30
- 22 days of finalizing a change to any of the programs or

- 24 (b) Not later than May 1st of each year, beginning on May 1, 2020,

- 1 each utility owning or operating transmission or distribution
- 2 assets shall complete a report, as prescribed by the Public Utility
- 3 Commission of Texas, which includes, but is not limited to the
- 4 following:
- 5 (1) percentage of transmission and/or distribution system
- 6 or assets inspected in the prior calendar year;
- 7 (2) percentage of transmission and/or distribution system
- 8 anticipated to by inspected in the current calendar year;
- 9 (3) number of incidents reported by employees or the public
- 10 regarding transmission or distribution assets that are not in
- 11 compliance with the National Electric Safety Code, in whatever
- 12 manner they are reported;
- 13 (4) if the utility is aware of any portion of its

- 19 (6) the number of fatalities or injuries resulting from
