## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to supplemental environmental projects authorized by the
3	Texas Commission on Environmental Quality.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 7.067, Water Code, is amended by adding
6	Subsections (d), (e), and (f) to read as follows:
7	(d) The commission may determine the types of projects that
8	may be approved as a supplemental environmental project. For a
9	respondent that is a local government, those types of projects must
10	<pre>include:</pre>
11	(1) purchasing, operating, or maintaining:
12	(A) alternative fuel vehicles, including
13	passenger cars, light trucks, heavy trucks, and buses; and
14	(B) alternative fuel heavy equipment, including
15	tractors, bulldozers, front-end loaders, and motor graders;
16	(2) constructing, operating, or maintaining
17	alternative fuel refueling infrastructure necessary to operate an
18	alternative fuel fleet; and
19	(3) providing energy efficiency upgrades to buildings
20	and facilities owned by the local government, including heating,
21	ventilation, air conditioning, lighting, and building envelope
22	upgrades.
23	(e) For a supplemental environmental project involving
24	alternative fuel vehicles, the commission:

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1	(1) must allow the project to include:
2	(A) the entire cost of the vehicle; and
3	(B) any alternative fuel equipment or upgrades
4	involved; and
5	(2) may not limit the project to including only the
6	difference in cost between conventional fuel vehicles, equipment,
7	or upgrades and the alternative fuel counterparts.
8	(f) The commission:
9	(1) may not require a contract associated with a
10	supplemental environmental project to be for a term of less than
11	five years; and
12	(2) must allow a contract associated with a
13	supplemental environmental project to be renewable for periods of
14	at least five years.
15	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
