IN RE: **HB364** by Tinderholt (relating to required alcohol monitoring and ignition interlock devices ordered by a court and a central database of those orders; creating a criminal offense.), **Committee Report 1st House, Substituted**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

It is assumed that the provisions of the bill relating to required alcohol monitoring and ignition interlock devices ordered by a court, a central database for those orders, and the creation of a new Class C misdemeanor could be absorbed using existing resources.
