IN RE: HB374 by Allen (relating to meetings or visits between a defendant on community supervision and a supervision officer.), Committee Report 2nd House, Substituted

#### No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend the Government Code to require community supervision and corrections departments to adopt a policy regarding the scheduling of meetings with defendants on community supervision in a manner that accommodates the defendant's work, treatment, or community service schedule. The bill would also permit the use of videoconference technology. The provisions of the bill would not have a significant fiscal impact. The bill would take effect on September 1, 2019.

#### **Local Government Impact**

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
