IN RE: HB521 by Dutton (Relating to the charging instrument in the prosecution of the offense of resisting arrest.), **As Introduced**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend the Code of Criminal Procedure by requiring any complaint, information, or indictment in the prosecution of a criminal offense related to resisting arrest must state the underlying offense for which the person was resisting arrest. Based on the analysis of the Office of Court Administration, duties and responsibilities associated with implementing the provisions of the bill could be accomplished with existing resources.

Local Government Impact

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
