**IN RE: HB1932** by Thierry (Relating to the inclusion of catastrophic debris management in county emergency management programs.), **As Engrossed**

**No fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.**

The bill would amend the Government Code to require that certain emergency management programs associated with counties must provide for catastrophic debris management by January 1, 2020.

**Local Government Impact**

According to Polk County, it would cost the county approximately \$30,000 to hire a consultant to assist the county with the implementation of the bill.

According to Harris County, the bill would not have a significant fiscal impact on the county.
