IN RE: HB2012 by Lucio III (relating to conditions of community supervision for defendants convicted of certain criminal offenses involving animals.), **Committee Report 1st House, Substituted**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend the Code of Criminal Procedure to allow a judge that grants community supervision to a defendant convicted of certain offenses related to cruelty to animals to prohibit the defendant from possessing animals and require participation in certain counseling programs.

Based on the analysis of the Office of Court Administration, duties and responsibilities associated with implementing the provisions of the bill could be accomplished using existing resources.

The bill would take effect September 1, 2019.

Local Government Impact

According to the Texas Association of Counties, no fiscal implication to counties is anticipated.
