IN RE: HB2058 by Hernandez (Relating to the use of proceeds from criminal asset forfeiture to provide services to domestic victims of trafficking.), **As Introduced**

The bill would amend the Code of Criminal Procedure to authorize the use of asset forfeiture funds to cover the costs of a contract with a municipal or county program to provide services to domestic victims of trafficking.
