IN RE: HB3024 by Deshotel (Relating to the feasibility of creating and maintaining a coastal barrier system.), **As Introduced**

The bill would create a joint interim committee, comprised of certain members of the Senate and House of Representatives, to study the feasibility and desirability of creating and maintaining a coastal barrier system. The bill would require the committee to provide a report of its findings and recommendations to the governor and legislature no later than December 1, 2020.

The committee would be abolished January 11, 2021.

It is assumed that implementing the provision of this bill could be accomplished utilizing existing resources.

Local Government Impact

No fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
