IN RE: HB3554 by Farrar (Relating to the admissibility of certain forensic analyses and associated testimony regarding physical evidence in a criminal case.), As Introduced

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend the Code of Criminal Procedure to require certain forensic analyses be performed by an accredited laboratory in order for the analyses to be admissible in court. Based on the analysis of the Office of Court Administration and the Department of Public Safety, duties and responsibilities associated with implementing the provisions of the bill could be accomplished using existing resources.

The bill would take effect September 1, 2019.
