IN RE: SB253 by Rodríguez (Relating to expedited proceedings in cases involving dangerously damaged or deteriorated or substandard buildings or improvements in a municipality.), **As Introduced**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend the Civil Practice and Remedies Code to allow a person to appeal an interlocutory order if the court denied a motion filed by a governmental entity in actions related to dangerously damaged or deteriorated structures or improvements. The bill would also amend Local Government Code to require courts to expedite proceedings related to a suit brought for enforcement of an ordinance relating to dangerously damaged or deteriorated structures or improvements. Based on the analysis of the Office of Court Administration, duties and responsibilities associated with implementing the provisions of the bill could be accomplished using existing resources.

Local Government Impact

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
