**IN RE:** **SB494** by Huffman (Relating to certain procedures applicable to meetings under the open meetings law and the disclosure of public information under the public information law in the event of an emergency, urgent public necessity, or catastrophic event.), **Committee Report 1st House, Substituted**

**No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.**

Based on analysis by the Office of the Attorney General, it is assumed that the provisions of the bill relating to public information requests related to open meetings could be absorbed using existing resources.
