IN RE: SB498 by Huffman (Relating to a commercial landlord's or tenant's remedies regarding certain unlawful activities in a multiunit commercial property.), As Engrossed

No fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend the Property Code to add certain massage establishments to a list of definitions related to prostitution and the trafficking of persons and to require that landlords allow tenants in multiunit commercial buildings where such activity is occurring to vacate a lease under certain conditions.
