IN RE: **SB632** by Kolkhorst (Relating to the composition of the governing bodies and the consultation policies of local mental health authorities with respect to sheriffs, their representatives, and local law enforcement agencies.), **Committee Report 1st House, Substituted**

No fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend the Health and Safety Code to require local mental health authority governing bodies to have certain specified governance and communications relationships with local law enforcement agencies. The bill would also modify the composition of the boards of trustees of these authorities.

According to the Health and Human Services Commission, no fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

Local Government Impact

According to the Health and Human Services Commission, no fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.

According to the Texas Association of Counties, no significant fiscal impact to counties is anticipated.
