**IN RE:** SB708 by Zaffirini (Relating to collection and use of child safety data for licensed day-care centers.), **As Passed 2nd House**

**No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.**

The bill would amend Chapter 42 of the Human Resources Code to require the Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC), in collaboration with the Department of Family and Protective Services (DFPS), to collect, compile, and publish data related to incidents reported at licensed day-care centers. The bill would require HHSC to collect certain data for children four years of age and younger in a licensed day-care center, collect and publish data on its website on the total number of employees who left employment with each licensed day-care center, make data in this section available to certain researchers, and provide an annual report to the Legislature. The bill would require HHSC, in collaboration with DFPS and using existing resources, to research, collect, compile, and publish on its website certain data aggregated by child age regarding incidents at a location other than a licensed day-care center. The bill would also require HHSC to review the data collected and submit a report to the Legislature no later than January 1, 2021 that includes recommendations by age group to enhance child safety.

The bill would take effect immediately upon receiving a two-thirds majority vote in each house. Otherwise, the bill would take effect September 1, 2019.

According to HHSC, there would be minimal costs to modify existing applications and to collect, analyze, and report the required data. LBB analysis of HHSC and DFPS assumes that the provisions of the bill could be absorbed using existing resources.

**Local Government Impact**

No fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
