The bill would amend the Labor Code relating to judicial review of certain workers' compensation disputes. Based on information provided by the Texas Department of Insurance, State Office of Risk Management, Texas Department of Transportation, The University of Texas System Administration, and Texas A&M University System Administration, this analysis assumes the duties and responsibilities associated with implementing the provisions of the bill could be accomplished by utilizing existing resources.
