IN RE: **SB1045** by Hughes (Relating to academic accountability ratings for certain school districts and open-enrollment charter schools that offer full-time online programs through the state virtual school network.), **As Introduced**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend the Education Code as it relates to academic accountability ratings for certain school districts and open-enrollment charter schools that offer full-time online programs through the state virtual school network.

This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

Local Government Impact

No fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
