Estimated Two-year Net Impact to General Revenue Related Funds for SB1504, Committee Report 1st House, Substituted: an impact of \$0 through the biennium ending August 31, 2021.

Fiscal Analysis

The bill would amend various Education Code provisions relating to the uses of the B-On-Time student loan account. Under provisions of the bill, the B-On-Time student loan account would be

abolished on September 1, 2021 and balances remaining in the account would be used for a performance-based methodology that allocates funding based on the average number of bachelor's degrees awarded by each institution to at-risk students in the three most recent academic years for which the information is available.

Methodology

Based on information provided by the Comptroller of Public Accounts, the fiscal year 2020 ending balance for the B-On Time Student Loan Account is projected to be \$134.5 million. For purposes of this fiscal note, it assumed that the balances in the B-On-Time account would be allocated to institutions on September 1, 2021 (fiscal year 2022).

Local Government Impact

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
