IN RE: SB1543 by Menéndez (Relating to providing notice of the right to record Department of Family and Protective Services investigative interviews.), As Introduced

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend Chapter 40 of the Human Resources Code to require an investigator to orally notify interviewees at the beginning of an interview for a Department of Family and Protective Services investigation that the interviewee has the right to make an audio recording of the interview and to note that the interviewee was notified. It is assumed that the provisions of the bill could be implemented using existing resources. The bill would take effect immediately upon receiving a two-thirds majority vote in each house. Otherwise, the bill would take effect September 1, 2019.

Local Government Impact

No fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
