#### A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to fees for vehicles stored at vehicle storage facilities;
3	authorizing fee increases and decreases; eliminating a fee;
4	eliminating a minimum fee.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Sections 2303.155(a) and (b), Occupations Code,
7	are amended to read as follows:
8	(a) For the purposes of this section, "governmental vehicle
9	storage facility" means a garage, parking lot, or other facility
10	that is:
11	$\underline{(1)}$ [ $\overline{(A)}$ ] owned by a governmental entity; and
12	(2) [ $(B)$ ] used to store or park at least 10 vehicles
13	each year.
14	(b) The operator of a vehicle storage facility or
15	governmental vehicle storage facility may charge the owner of a
16	vehicle stored or parked at the facility:
17	(1) a notification fee set in a reasonable amount for
18	providing notice under this subchapter, including notice under
19	Section 2303.154(c);
20	(2) an impoundment fee of \$20, subject to Section
21	<u>2303.1552</u> , for any action that:
22	(A) is taken by or at the direction of the owner
23	or operator of the facility; and
24	(B) is necessary to preserve, protect, or service

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- 1 a vehicle stored or parked at the facility;
- 2 (3) a daily storage fee, subject to Section 2303.1552,
- 3 of:
- 4 (A) [not less than \$5 and not more than] \$20 for
- 5 each day or part of a day the vehicle is stored at the facility if
- 6 the vehicle is not longer than 25 feet; or
- 7 (B) \$35 for each day or part of a day the vehicle
- 8 is stored at the facility if the vehicle is longer than 25 feet; and
- 9 (4) any fee that is required to be submitted to a law
- 10 enforcement agency, the agency's authorized agent, or a
- 11 governmental entity [ + and
- [(5) a fee in an amount set by the commission for the
- 13 remediation, recovery, or capture of an environmental or biological
- 14 hazard].
- 15 SECTION 2. Subchapter D, Chapter 2303, Occupations Code, is
- 16 amended by adding Section 2303.1552 to read as follows:
- 17 Sec. 2303.1552. BIENNIAL ADJUSTMENT OF CERTAIN FEES. (a)
- 18 In this section, "consumer price index" means the Consumer Price
- 19 Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) published by the Bureau of
- 20 Labor Statistics of the United States Department of Labor.
- 21 (b) On January 1 of each even-numbered year, the impoundment
- 22 fee under Section 2303.155(b)(2) and the storage fees under Section
- 23 2303.155(b)(3) are increased or decreased by an amount equal to the
- 24 amount of the applicable fee in effect on December 31 of the
- 25 preceding year multiplied by the percentage increase or decrease in
- 26 the consumer price index during the preceding state fiscal
- 27 biennium.

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- 1 (c) Not later than November 1 of each odd-numbered year, the
- 2 <u>commission shall:</u>
- 3 (1) adjust the fees in accordance with Subsection (b);
- 4 and
- 5 (2) publish the adjusted fees on the department's
- 6 <u>Internet website.</u>
- 7 (d) If a fee is decreased under this section, the operator
- 8 of a vehicle storage facility or governmental vehicle storage
- 9 facility, as defined by Section 2303.155, shall begin charging the
- 10 adjusted fee on the effective date of the decrease. If a fee is
- 11 increased under this section, the operator may begin charging the
- 12 adjusted fee at any time on or after the effective date of the
- 13 increase.
- 14 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 15 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 18 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

# No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would require the Texas Commission of Licensing and Regulation to biennially adjust fees which a vehicle storage facility may charge related to a vehicle's storage according to the percentage increase or decrease, if any, in the Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W) most recently published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics. The bill would also require the commission to notify licensed vehicle storage facilities of the adjustment, and to allow a reasonable period for implementation of the adjustment.

The bill would take effect September 1, 2019.

It is assumed that the provisions of the bill relating to the adjustment of fees for vehicles stored at vehicle storage facilities and any potential increase in complaints against those regulated facilities could be absorbed using existing resources at the Department of Licensing and Regulation.
