(a) A person may not be appointed adjutant general, a deputy adjutant general, a general officer, judge advocate general, or [executive] director <u>of state administration</u> if the person is required to register as a lobbyist under Chapter 305 because of the person's activities for compensation on behalf of a profession related to the operation of the department.

(b) An officer, employee, or paid consultant of a Texas trade association in the field of defense or veterans affairs may not be appointed adjutant general, a deputy adjutant general, a general officer, judge advocate general, or [executive] director <u>of</u> <u>state administration</u>.

(c) A person who is the spouse of an officer, manager, orpaid consultant of a Texas trade association in the field of defense

1 or veterans affairs may not be appointed adjutant general, a deputy 2 adjutant general, a general officer, judge advocate general, or 3 [executive] director of state administration.

4 SECTION 6. Section 437.062(b), Government Code, is amended 5 to read as follows:

6 (b) A deputy adjutant general, general officer, or 7 [executive] director <u>of state administration</u> employed under this 8 chapter is entitled to a salary subject to the classification and 9 salary schedule provisions defined in the General Appropriations 10 Act.

SECTION 7. Section 437.063, Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 437.063. ADJUTANT GENERAL: DELEGATION OF EXPENDITURE APPROVAL AUTHORITY. The adjutant general may delegate the authority to approve department expenditures to the [executive] director of state administration.

SECTION 8. Section 437.101, Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 437.101. [EXECUTIVE] 19 DIRECTOR OF STATE (a) The [executive] director 20 ADMINISTRATION. of state administration is a senior-level [an] employee of the department 21 and is appointed by and serves at the pleasure of the adjutant 22 23 general.

(b) Subject to Sections 437.052 and 437.054, the [executive] director <u>of state administration</u> may enter into contracts related to the purposes or duties of the department and may have and use a corporate seal.

1 (c) The [executive] director <u>of state administration</u> is 2 responsible for the daily administration of the <u>department's state</u> 3 <u>support operations</u> [department] and the operational compliance 4 with the cooperative agreements between the department and the 5 National Guard Bureau.

6 <u>(d) The adjutant general shall adopt and implement a policy</u> 7 <u>outlining the director of state administration's responsibility</u> 8 <u>for state administrative interests across all department programs</u>, 9 <u>including evaluating procedures for oversight of state employees</u> 10 <u>and mitigating administrative and other compliance risks</u>.

SECTION 9. Section 437.102, Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 437.102. DEPARTMENT PERSONNEL. (a) The [executive] director of state administration may hire employees as necessary to carry on the <u>state support</u> operations of the department.

16 (b) The [executive] director <u>of state administration</u> or the 17 <u>director of state administration's</u> [executive director's] designee 18 shall provide to the adjutant general and to department employees, 19 as often as necessary, information regarding the requirements for 20 office or employment under this chapter, including information 21 regarding a person's responsibilities under applicable laws 22 relating to standards of conduct for state officers or employees.

23 SECTION 10. Section 437.104, Government Code, is amended to 24 read as follows:

25 Sec. 437.104. CAREER LADDER PROGRAM; PERFORMANCE 26 EVALUATIONS. (a) The [executive] director <u>of state administration</u> 27 shall develop a career ladder program. The program must require

intra-agency postings of all non-entry level positions
 concurrently with any public posting.

A member of the state military forces who is not a 13 (f) 14 full-time or part-time state employee and who has been on state 15 active duty or on state training or other duty for more than 60 consecutive days is, notwithstanding Section 1551.1055, Insurance 16 17 Code, eligible to participate in the state group benefits program under Chapter 1551, Insurance Code, and is considered to be a 18 19 full-time state employee for the purposes of that chapter, including the receipt of a full state contribution for insurance 20 21 coverage, subject to Subsection (f-1) and the following requirements: 22

(1) the participant must be a member of the state
 military forces at the time of enrollment in the group benefits
 program; and

1 established by the Employees Retirement System of Texas.

2 SECTION 14. Sections 437.226(c) and (h), Government Code, 3 are amended to read as follows:

4 The adjutant general shall grant assistance for tuition (c) 5 and mandatory fees under this section to eligible service members, in an amount not to exceed the amount provided in the General 6 Appropriations Act. The adjutant general may apportion the number 7 8 of assistance awards among the components of the Texas military forces necessary to meet the recruitment and retention needs of 9 10 those components. [The number of assistance awards made to members of the Texas State Guard may not exceed 30 for any semester unless 11 the adjutant general finds a compelling need for additional awards 12 to members of the Texas State Guard.] 13

(h) From money appropriated for purposes of this section, the department shall authorize the comptroller to reimburse an institution of higher education in an amount equal to the amount of the [exemption from] tuition and mandatory fees [the institution grants to a person] under Section 54.345, Education Code.
