4 SECTION ____. Section 13.015(a-1), Parks and Wildlife Code, 5 is amended to read as follows:

6 (a-1) The commission may waive the park entrance fee for a 7 person who is at least 70 years of age, a student enrolled in the 8 <u>fifth grade, or a child who is 11 years of age</u>. The commission 9 may not waive the fee for use of a park facility, including a hook-10 up fee for electricity or water.
