5	SECTION 1. Section 501.091, Transportation Code, is amended
6	by adding Subdivision (4-a) and amending Subdivision (15) to read
7	as follows:
8	(4-a) "Flood vehicle":
9	(A) means a motor vehicle that was submerged in a
10	level of water higher than a doorsill of the vehicle or had water
11	enter the passenger, trunk, or engine compartment and:
12	(i) water came into contact with electrical
13	components of the vehicle;
14	(ii) because of the water, the vehicle
15	requires repair to, or replacement of, any mechanical component to
16	operate; or
17	(iii) an insurance company paid a claim as a
18	result of damage from the water; and
19	(B) does not include a motor vehicle designed for
20	and capable of water submersion for recreational or other purposes
21	unless the submersion results in damage to:
22	(i) electrical safety components; or
23	(ii) a major component part.
24	(15) "Salvage motor vehicle" means a motor vehicle

1 that: 2 (A) has damage to or is missing a major component 3 part to the extent that the cost of repairs, including parts and labor other than the cost of materials and labor for repainting the 4 5 motor vehicle and excluding sales tax on the total cost of repairs, exceeds the actual cash value of the motor vehicle immediately 6 before the damage; [or] 7 (B) comes into this state under an out-of-state 8 salvage motor vehicle title or similar out-of-state ownership 9 10 document; or (C) is a flood vehicle. 11 SECTION 2. Sections 501.097(c) and (c-1), Transportation 12 Code, are amended to read as follows: 13 14 (C) A [printed] nonrepairable vehicle title must state on 15 its face that the motor vehicle: (1)16 may not: 17 (A) be repaired, rebuilt, or reconstructed; be issued a title or registered in this (B) 18 19 state; be operated on a public highway, in addition 20 (C) to any other requirement of law; and 21 may only be used as a source for used parts or 22 (2) 23 scrap metal. 24 (c-1) The department's titling system must include a remark that clearly identifies the vehicle as a salvage motor vehicle or 25 26 nonrepairable motor vehicle. SECTION 3. Section 501.1002, Transportation 27 Code, is

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1 amended to read as follows: Sec. 501.1002. OWNER-RETAINED VEHICLES. (a) If 2 an 3 insurance company pays a claim on a nonrepairable motor vehicle or salvage motor vehicle and the insurance company does not acquire 4 5 ownership of the motor vehicle, the insurance company shall: (1)submit to the department, before the 31st day 6 7 after the date of the payment of the claim, on the form prescribed 8 by the department, a report stating that the insurance company: has paid a claim on the motor vehicle; [and] 9 (A) 10 (B) has not acquired ownership of the motor vehicle; and 11 12 (C) has determined that the motor vehicle is a salvage motor vehicle or a nonrepairable motor vehicle; and 13 14 (2) provide notice to the owner of the motor vehicle 15 of: the report required under Subdivision (1); 16 (A) 17 [and] (B) the requirements for operation or transfer of 18 19 ownership of the motor vehicle under Subsection (b); and (C) the insurance company's determination that 20 the motor vehicle is a salvage motor vehicle or a nonrepairable 21 22 motor vehicle. The owner of a salvage motor vehicle or nonrepairable 23 (b) 24 motor vehicle may not transfer ownership of the motor vehicle by sale or otherwise unless the department has issued a salvage 25 26 vehicle title, salvage record of title, nonrepairable vehicle

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title, or nonrepairable record of title for the motor vehicle or a

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comparable ownership document has been issued by another state or
 jurisdiction for the motor vehicle in the name of the owner.

3 (c) Notwithstanding any other provision of this subchapter, 4 on receipt of a report required under Subsection (a) for a vehicle 5 described by that subsection, the department shall issue for the 6 vehicle in the name of the owner, as applicable:

7 (1) a salvage vehicle title or a salvage record of 8 title for a salvage motor vehicle; or

9 (2) a nonrepairable vehicle title or a nonrepairable
 10 record of title for a nonrepairable motor vehicle.

11 (d) The department shall collect the fee authorized under 12 this subchapter for the issuance of a title or record of title under 13 Subsection (c). The department shall waive the fee if the report 14 required under Subsection (a)(1) is submitted through the 15 department's titling system.

16 SECTION 4. Subchapter E, Chapter 501, Transportation Code, 17 is amended by adding Section 501.1004 to read as follows:

Sec. 501.1004. FLOOD VEHICLES. (a) A salvage vehicle title, salvage record of title, nonrepairable vehicle title, or nonrepairable record of title issued by the department for a flood vehicle or any title or record of title subsequently issued by the department for a flood vehicle must bear a notation that the department considers appropriate for a flood vehicle.

24 (b) An entity that takes possession of a flood vehicle 25 issued ownership documents without the notation required under 26 Subsection (a) shall:

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(1) submit, on a form prescribed by the department, a

1	report to the department before the 31st day after the date the
2	entity takes possession of the flood vehicle, unless the entity:
3	(A) is an insurance company or salvage pool
4	operator as defined by Section 2302.001, Occupations Code; and
5	(B) obtains an ownership document for the vehicle
6	that bears the notation required by Subsection (a) before the
7	entity transfers the vehicle; and
8	(2) if the entity is a lienholder in possession of the
9	vehicle under Chapter 54, 59, or 70, Property Code, or Chapter 2303,
10	Occupations Code, apply to the department for the appropriate title
11	in accordance with Section 501.097 before offering the vehicle for
12	public sale.
